BROKER UPDATE

Please be advised that this firm represents the Affiliated Physicians and Employers Master Trust d/b/a Members Health Plan NJ (the "Plan"), the debtor and debtor-in-possession in the above chapter 11 bankruptcy case, commenced on May 24, 2021 (the "Petition Date"), in the United States Bankruptcy Court for the District of New Jersey. The above case number has been assigned to this proceeding. The purpose of this letter is to inform you that the Plan has been directed by the New Jersey Department of Banking and Insurance ("NJ DOBI") to winddown operations. The practical effect of NJ DOBI's directive is that the Plan will terminate all coverage as of December 31, 2021.

Due to federal bankruptcy laws, the Plan is not authorized to pay debts arising prior to the Petition Date. Moreover, at this time, the Plan has insufficient funds to cover the total value of those debts arising prior to the Petition Date. The Plan is using the bankruptcy proceeding in an effort to secure an orderly winddown of operations, as well as seek alternative and outside funding for the purpose of reducing the burden on the Plan members to cover expenses related to the continuing accrual of medical and prescription claims.

In the meantime, the Plan is discontinuing its Broker Commission Program. Should any broker or broker agency which is party to a contract with the Plan believe the Plan is indebted to them, we encourage you to file a proof of claim with the Clerk of the U.S. Bankruptcy Court, **no later than August 2, 2021**. It is in your best interest, as well as that of the Plan members, to contact your state legislator to encourage them to take all measures to extend to the Plan public funds currently available through the American Rescue Plan Act. Public funding will help to ensure the Plan will have sufficient resources to cover its debts, including those detailed in a proof of claim filed by you.
